Letter from the President



Dear members, alumni, and friends,

For those of you who don't know me, my name is Brian Hoefling. I've head the pleasure to serve on the board of the Yale Club since 2015, and the honor to serve as its president since July 1 of last year. It amazes me that a year has passed already. Time goes by quickly when one keeps busy, and 2018 was a busy year for us indeed!

In the spring, we began a partnership with the Boston College Club, enabling our members to use their facilities and partially undoing the mistake of selling our own clubhouse in 1934. In June, we debuted a new annual meeting format: that of a fundraising auction, with items donated by alumni and connected in some way to Yale. It was such a successful event that we decided to bring it back in 2019. At the annual meeting, we also said goodbye to our long-serving administrator, Adele Beggs, and our treasurer of at least twenty-four years, John Pattillo, both of whom have retired from Yale Club life. Jennifer Madar concluded three successful years as president and handed the reins to me.

The autumn was largely taken up with preparations for The Game at Fenway Park, a massive undertaking even by the standards of The Game. Due to the lack of public tailgating spaces, the YaleBoston event was expected to be the largest single destination other than the park itself. In the end, the "tailgate" and viewing party we produced at the Hotel Commonwealth in partnership with AYA drew over seven hundred people, making it the largest single event we've held in living memory. Also in November, board member Lou Brenner received an award at the AYA Assembly for his long-running Day of Service site, "Pots, Plants, and Paints."

Thanks to the success of the auction and the continued support of our members through dues and donations, we closed out 2018 in our strongest financial position in at least five years. I have every confidence that 2019 will be another productive year for the club. Already we've reformed our committee system to increase opportunities for our members to take an active role in club operations. We've also begun shoring up our community service and educational outreach programs.

Going forward, I aim to strengthen our relationship with the BC Club and identify other benefits we can offer, make some small but necessary reforms to our bylaws, develop budgetary guidelines that enable longer-term planning, build up a financial reserve, and begin work on a leadership pipeline that can serve the club for years to come.

THE GAME at Fenway

Harvard hosted the Bulldogs at Fenway Park this year, making it the first year since 1912 that The Game had been played anywhere other than Harvard Stadium or the Yale Bowl. The 135th Yale-Harvard Game also marked the 50th anniversary of the famous 29-29 contest at Harvard Stadium. Some 34,675 tickets were sold, and the teams scored a record-setting 72 points combined.

Although the Crimson left victorious on the field, there can be no doubt that Yale won the tailgate. Before and during the action at Fenway, seven hundred alumni and guests joined us



across the 'Pike at the Hotel Commonwealth for our tailgate and viewing party. We rented out a suite of function spaces with a wall of windows facing the park and five TVs and projection screens to watch The Game once it began. In addition to our members and local alumni, our guests included current Yale professors, the executive director of the AYA, the president of Mory's, and officers of regional Yale clubs from around the country.

Over the course of six hours, attendees enjoyed breakfast and then lunch, as well as full bar service, a facepainting and merchandise room, and professional photography. The event was tied together with little Yale touches, from New Haven-style mashed potato pizza to batched Yale Cocktails and bourbon made by a distiller alumnus. And for the first time, we were able to produce a map of area tailgates (with the help of John Boak of the Colorado Yale Association) for the benefit of everyone coming to Boston for The Game.



I was honored to produce this event in partnership with longtime YaleBoston tailgate coordinator Don Hancock, AYA staff members Diane Morrissey, Nory Babbitt, and Jeannie Daniel, and AYA executive director Weili Cheng. Our largest single event in living memory, this tailgate persuades me there's no logistical challenge we cannot rise to – although I'm very grateful that things will be back to normal in 2020.
